## **School Reports - Semester 2 2024**

#### Dear Parents,

In Term 3 2024, the Minster for Education clarified the requirements for reporting on student progress and achievement. As such the Department of Education worked with the school Curriculum and Standards Authority to clarify the following:

- There is a requirement to provide an overall teacher comment, the content of which is determined by the school.
- There is <u>no requirement</u> to provide learning area comments.
- There is <u>no requirement</u> to provide grades at the strand or sub-strand level, only an overall learning area grade.
- There is <u>no requirement</u> to provide a learning area comment for students with special educational needs.

I met with staff and the school board in Term 4 2024 to discuss the implications of changing our current Reporting to Parents guidelines with respect to:

- Reducing staff workload in response to the Minister's announcement.
- Providing meaningful information about student achievement and progress to parents.
- Finding a compromise between reducing staff workload while continuing to provide meaningful commentbased feedback about student learning to parents via end-of-semester reports.

#### In addition to the minimum reporting requirements as stated in the SCASA guidelines, staff have committed to:

- Providing sub-strand grades for English and mathematics. An overall grade will be provided for other learning areas.
- Providing a comment for English and mathematics. No comments will be provided for other learning areas.
- Continuing to provide grades for all learning areas in Pre-primary (requirement only to provide English and mathematics grades).
- Providing a portfolio / work samples for Kindergarten and Pre-primary students (there is no requirement for staff to do this).
- Providing a Kindergarten report with an overall judgement for each of the Early Years Learning Framework outcomes.

I thank staff for committing to provide above and beyond the minimum requirements in regards to Reporting to Parents in Semester 2 this year.



# **Allergy Aware School**



Best Practice Resources funded by the Australian Government Department of Health



December 2024

Dear parents and carers,

We are seeking your help to support future students in our school with severe allergies including Heidi James who will be enrolling in 2025.

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that is potentially life-threatening. The most common causes of anaphylaxis in schools are allergies to food and insects (bees). To help manage allergies, our school is following the National Allergy Council's *Best Practice Guidelines for Anaphylaxis Prevention and Management in Schools*.

The Best Practice Guidelines recommend an Allergy Aware approach, which means we are supporting students at risk of anaphylaxis in the following ways:

- training staff
- educating students about allergies and anaphylaxis
- · teaching students that we all have different needs and to be respectful of others
- teaching students the importance of getting help immediately if their friend with allergy looks sick.

For food allergies, we are also:

- encouraging students with food allergies to wash their hands before and after eating
- · encouraging students to wash their hands after eating something their classmate or friend is allergic to
- teaching students not to share food with friends who have food allergy.

Food allergies are common in school aged children and avoiding the food is the only way to prevent an allergic reaction. Therefore, we have put a range of different things in place to help keep students with allergies safe. In younger primary classes, we may send letters home to suggest ways to support a child with food allergies that are additional to those listed above.

We ask you to support the school's Allergy Aware approach so that we can increase safety and provide an environment that meets the needs of all our students.

Thank you for helping our school be "Allergy Aware".

# **Bushfire Planning**

#### **Bushfire Zoning**

Hyden Primary School has been placed on the Department of Education bushfire zone register as it is located in a designated bushfire risk area.

If a fire behaviour index of 75 (extreme fire danger) or greater is forecast for the Shire of Kondinin, a school may be required to invoke a pre-emptive (planned) closure. A 'catastrophic' fire danger rating poses a significant threat to the school if a fire starts. It is likely to be uncontrollable, unpredictable and fast-moving.

Parents and carers will receive a text message or phone call to inform them of a possible pre-emptive closure of the school.

The final decision to pre-emptively close the school will be confirmed with the principal no later than 4:30 pm on the day before the pre-emptive closure. If the forecast changes after the 4:30 pm deadline, the school remains closed.

Parents and carers will receive a text message or phone call to either confirm or cancel a pre-emptive closure of the school.

Typically, schools will be required to close for a day at a time however, this will depend on changing weather conditions. Parents and carers will receive a text message to advise if the school will reopen the day after the pre-emptive closure, or whether it will remain closed.
